ANC4C WEIGHS REDISTRICTING

An ANC 4C Redistricting Meeting was held on Thursday, September 8th at 6:30 pm at the MPD Patrol Services Bureau Building, 801 Shepherd Street NW, Community Room.

Joseph Vaughan, ANC 4C Commissioner and Chair, and Commissioner Robert Mandle are among the commissioners sitting on a committee formed by Ward 4 Councilmember Muriel Bowser that is looking at all of Ward 4's four Advisory Neighborhood Commission borders.

The group is looking at the borders affecting single-member districts represented by Joseph Martin (SMD 4C09), Jean Badalamenti (SMD 4C03) and Janet Myers (SMD 4C02). The Commissioners agreed to realign the areas west of 16th Street from 4C02 and 4C03 into ANC 4A (Crestwood); to rebalance by moving parts of 4C05 to 4C03; as well as moving parts of 4A07 to 4C02. The Commissioners agreed to keep 4C09 intact, and request that Rock Creek Cemetery be moved into 4C09 from 4D.

A map of 4C's ten single-member districts (http://anc4c.org/map.html), currently shows a lop-sided ANC 4C representation of Georgia Avenue, reaching north to Missouri on the west side of Georgia Avenue (SMD 4C01) and ending at Buchanan Street NW (SMD 4C07) on the east side. SMD 4C09 includes half of Sherman Circle.

The DC Council will vote on the new boundaries later this year. Elections for commissioners will take place in November 2012. However the process affecting the shape of ANC 4C is taking place right now. Please get involved if you are interested.
