SUMMARY:

Alcoholic Beverage Regulation Administration (ABRA) Investigator Earl Jones determined that on Saturday, April 20, 2013, at approximately 10:05 p.m., Petworth Liquors, located at 3210 Georgia Ave. N.W. Washington, D.C., was in violation of D.C. Official Codes §25-446, and § 25-723. Specifically, Investigator Jones observed an intoxicated male appearing to be intoxicated and loitering, in front of the ABC establishment, which is in violation of their Settlement Agreement. Investigators Jones and Brooks also stood inside of the establishment and witnessed three individuals enter the location and purchase alcoholic beverages after its Board-approved hours of operation. These determinations were based on Investigator Jones' response to a complaint from a Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) official.

DETAILS:

On Saturday, April 20, 2013, at 9:30 p.m., ABRA Investigators Jones and Derek Brooks responded to Petworth Liquors, located at 3210 Georgia Ave. N.W., in response to an e-mail complaint from MPD (Exhibit #1). Investigators Jones and Brooks arrived at Petworth Liquors at approximately 9:50 p.m., and monitored the establishment from across the street. The investigators observed an intoxicated male sitting on a bucket lined with a cushion in front of the establishment (Exhibit #2). An employee of the establishment pulled the store front shutters down partially, but did not address the loitering male. After 10 minutes, the male stood to his feet and stumbled around. The male at one point stumbled onto Georgia Ave., N.W., and was nearly struck by a vehicle. The intoxicated male then opened the front door of the establishment, exchanged words with workers, and then left the premises.

Investigators Jones and Brooks then entered the establishment at 10:05 p.m., and observed three other patrons enter the establishment and purchase alcoholic beverages. The investigators then identified themselves and requested to speak with an ABC Manager or owner. Balbir Singh identified by his Virginia Driver's License (T60-81-9956; Exp 9/4/18), stated he was the owner. Investigator Jones stated the reason for the visit and advised Mr. Singh the time was 10:10 p.m., and Petworth Liquors was in violation operating after-hours. Mr. Singh then locked the door to the establishment, denying entry to other patrons who attempted to enter. Mr. Singh offered no explanation for operating after-hours. Investigator Jones then conducted a Regulatory Inspection (Exhibit #3), in which no other ABRA violations were found.

On Sunday, April 21, 2013, Investigator Jones responded to Officer Oliver, by e-mail, documenting violations that were found on Saturday, April 20, 2013 (Exhibit #4).

On Monday, April 22, 2013, Investigator Jones reviewed the ABRA records of Petworth Liquors, which revealed that the establishment had committed multiple violations of its Settlement Agreement. Petworth Liquors' Settlement Agreement has provisions concerning Hours of Operation, and Loitering on page three (3), under the heading Settlement Agreement 1), 3) (Exhibit #5):

WHEREAS, in recognition of the ABC Board's policy of encouraging parties to address neighborhood concerns by negotiating agreements, the parties hereto being desirous of entering into an agreement whereby Applicant will agree to adopt certain measures to address the ANC 1A's concerns and ANC 1A will agree to support the issuance of the ABC License.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and undertakings memorialized herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1) Hours of Operation: Applicant shall have the right but not be obligated to open its doors to receive patrons from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm Monday through Thursday, 9:00 am to 10:00 pm Friday and Saturday.
- 3) All due diligence shall be made by the Applicant to ensure that there is no loitering in front of or in the vicinity of the Store, especially loud cursing, public drunkenness, fighting, and other acts of aggression.



VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 13 day of 10, 4 , 2009 by and between Hundal, Inc. Va Petworth Liquors (hereinafter the "Applicant") and The Neighborhood Advisory Commission 1A ("ANC 1A")

WHEREAS, Applicant has filed an application with the District of Columbia Alcohol Beverage Control Board (hereinafter "ABC Board") for issuance of a class "A" license for the restaurant premises located at 3210 Georgia Avenue, NW, Washington D.C. 20010 (the "Store"); ABC Board license no. 072626.

WHEREAS, in recognition of the ABC Board's policy of encouraging parties to address neighborhood concerns by negotiating agreements, the parties hereto being desirous of entering into an agreement whereby Applicant will agree to adopt certain measures to address the ANC 1A's concerns and ANC 1A will agree to support the issuance of the ABC License.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and undertakings memorialized herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Cooperation: That licensee and its officers and employees will cooperate with the Advisory Neighborhood Commission IA ("ANC") and all community organizations to address any alleged violation of the laws and regulations referred to in Paragraph A above or of this agreement, and in any request that the appropriate enforcement agency investigate an alleged violation. Hours of Operation: Applicant shall have the right but not be obligated to open its doors to receive patrons from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm Monday through Thursday, 9:00 am to 10:00 pm on Friday and Saturday. The establishment shall be closed on Sunday in accordance with current regulations.
- 2. Noise Suppression: Sound emanating from any part of the establishment shall not be audible in residential structures in the vicinity. The Restaurant's operation shall at all times be in compliance with the D.C. Noise Control Act.
- 3. Loitering: All due diligence shall be made by the Applicant to ensure that there is no loitering in front of or in the vicinity of the Store, especially loud cursing, public drunkenness, fighting and other acts of aggression.
- 4. Trash Removal: Applicant will maintain regular trash/garbage removal service, a minimum of 2 times per week from the trash and dumpster area and see that those areas are regularly kept clean.
- 5. Intoxication: That licensee will not sell or deliver alcohol in any form to any intoxicated person.
- 6. Underage: That licensee will not sell or deliver alcohol in any form to any person less than 21 years of age.
- 7. "Go-cups": That licensee will not provide 'go-cups' to customers. A "go-cup" is defined in Section 709.7 of the ABC regulations as a "drinking utensil provided at no charge or a nominal charge to customers for the purpose of consuming beverages."
- 8. Adherence: That licensee will assure that all employees of licensee adhere to the provisions of this agreement, particularly with respect to the sale of alcohol in any form.
- 9. Signage: Not to have excessive alcoholic beverage signage in the establishment's windows (more than 25 % of total window area).
- 10. Right to Protest: The parties agree that if reasonable discussion of violations are not resolved, after notice to the Applicant, then any failure of the Applicant to adhere to the foregoing commitments would constitute a breach of this agreement and grounds for the ANC 1A to petition the Board for issuance of an order to Show Cause, as provided by the D.C. Regulations.
